The characters Jelly, Bean, Lotty, Kevin and Wellington are introduced in this book. The letters $j, k, P, V, W, y, z$ are introduced, so that all the letters of the alphabet except $q$ are used.
The letter $y$ is used as a vowel sound at the end of the words Jelly, puppy. Each story is written in complete sentences. Capital letters and punctuation are used. The 'tricky' words used are the, I, go, to.

1: as a consonant in 'yes, yet, you'. 2: as a vowel in 'my, fly, by, sky'.
3: as a vowel in 'happy, sorry, baby, tricky'. 4: as a vowel in 'gym, crystal'.
