

## Information for Teachers

This book is for children learning to read when the vocabulary in the story contains words with vowel digraphs and trigraphs.

Each vowel digraph or trigraph is introduced in the context of the story. Only one new digraph or trigraph is introduced in each story.

The digraphs and trigraphs introduced in this book are **igh, air, ear, ay.**

The consonant digraphs used in this book are **th, sh, ng.**

The high-frequency tricky words are **the, no, to, go, oh, all, I, are, my, you, going.**

<i>Night</i>	igh, oo, ow, ar, er, ee	night tight lights bright
<i>Long hair</i>	air, oo, or, ee	hair stairs Clair fair
<i>Ears</i>	ear, oo, ee	ears hear clear beard
<i>On the Hay</i>	ay, ee	play hay way day stay sways away

\*A digraph is two letters representing one sound.

\*A trigraph is three letters representing one sound.
